Culturally Responsive Services Tuesday, July 25th, 2023 Start: 2:00 PM ET End: 4:15 PM ET Instructors: Khalil Martin, LSW & Ryan Villagran, LSW

Many service providers have been taught the value of cultural competence in working with diverse populations. Indeed, cross-cultural clinical work is a frequent occurrence when serving communities of people with marginalized identities. This training presents the concept of cultural humility as supplemental to the work of cultural competence. Presenters will offer strategies to move beyond the idea that we can ever truly become competent in another person's culture, and explore opportunities to affirm and support our clients. Through use of case studies, we will review concepts of intersectionality and micro-aggressions for a fuller understanding of the ways culture shows up in service provision, and offer tools for a humbler cultural practice.

Learning objectives:

When attendees return to the workplace, they will be able to:

- Define the need to implement culturally responsive services
- Define cultural humility and compare and contrast with cultural competence
- Identify at least three ways to adjust current practice to align with a cultural humility framework

Khalil Martin, MSW, LSW (he/him), joined Pathways to Housing PA in 2021 and served in a clinical leadership role on an ACT team for individuals with Opioid Use Disorder before joining Housing First University as a Training Specialist in January 2023. Prior to this, Khalil worked as a Behavioral Health Therapist at runaway & homeless youth shelters throughout the tri-state area, as well as with Project HOME, where he assisted in the creation of the Gloria Casarez Residence– the first permanent supportive housing for LGBTQ+ young adults in Pennsylvania. Drawing from principles of feminist theory, Khalil uses a strength-based and personcentered approach to assist individuals in understanding and navigating various forms of oppression and how these systems impact one's personal and interpersonal experiences. Khalil received his Master's degree in clinical social work from The University of Pennsylvania.

Ryan Villagran, LSW (they/them) joined Housing First University in June 2021 as a Training Specialist. Ryan holds a Master of Social Work from Temple University with a concentration in Communities & Policy. His clinical background includes delivering psychiatric rehabilitation services in the mental health recovery model at a Community Integrated Recovery Center. Ryan also developed and coordinated a training program in a university setting for social workers serving transitional-aged youth and later taught a Human Behavior in the Social Environment course for graduate social work students. Ryan is involved in organizing efforts around ending mass incarceration and believes in the power of our collective imagination to dream of a better future centered around the most vulnerable members of our community.
