Goal Planning for Community Inclusion

The concept of Community Inclusion is often misunderstood in recovery services. While Community Inclusion can mean hosting special events and trips for our participants, it's also about helping people to reclaim their independence. Rather than grocery shopping on a person's behalf, staff have the opportunity to promote participant choice and self-determination by assisting individuals with the process of making a list, discussing recipes they would like to try, shopping together, and ultimately cooking that special meal side-by-side. This type of fulfilling and impactful engagement facilitates a greater degree of dignity and autonomy, while also building trust, rapport, and meaningful connection. In this workshop, attendees will learn strategies for helping service recipients to develop goal plans that are robust, achievable, and grounded in the tenets of Community Inclusion.

Learning objectives:

When attendees return to the workplace, they will be able to:

- Define community inclusion and the importance of utilizing it in service delivery
- Describe intersections of community inclusion and basic supports and their impacts on service recipients and staff
- Review case study examples of how of incorporating community inclusion practices in service delivery has positively impacted program participants

Target Audience: Social service providers and helping professionals with direct client contact, and their supervisors.

Course Delivery Format: Live webinar

Interactivity: This course will offer real-time polling, group discussion prompts, break-out groups, and 15 minutes of Q&A time.

Social Work Practice Level: This course is appropriate for beginner and intermediate BSW/MSW learners.

Renée Frink-Boyd, CPS (she/her), is a Training Specialist with Pathways to Housing PA's training and educational initiative, Housing First University. Renée first came to Pathways in 2015 and served as a Certified Peer Specialist (CPS) on a non-fidelity Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) team, where she focused on building meaningful connections with program participants with chronic health conditions. Later, she joined the Pathways' Center of Excellence as a Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Care Manager, where she assisted individuals with accessing MAT and MOUD services. Renée received her Peer Specialist certification in 2013. Her 10+ years of experience in the field includes working as an Employee Specialist at the Philadelphia Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual Disabilities, and as a CPS at Philadelphia area agencies including Horizon House and JFK Behavioral Health. Renée is passionate about building supportive peer relationships with individuals experiencing homelessness and managing co-occurring disorders.



Ryan Villagran, LSW (they/them) joined Housing First University in June 2021 as a Training Specialist. Ryan holds a Master of Social Work from Temple University with a concentration in Communities & Policy. Their clinical background includes delivering psychiatric rehabilitation services in the mental health recovery model at a Community Integrated Recovery Center. Ryan also developed and coordinated a training program in a university setting for social workers serving transitional-aged youth and later taught a Human Behavior in the Social Environment course for graduate social work students. Ryan is involved in organizing efforts around ending mass incarceration and believes in the power of our collective imagination to dream of a better future centered around the most vulnerable members of our community.
